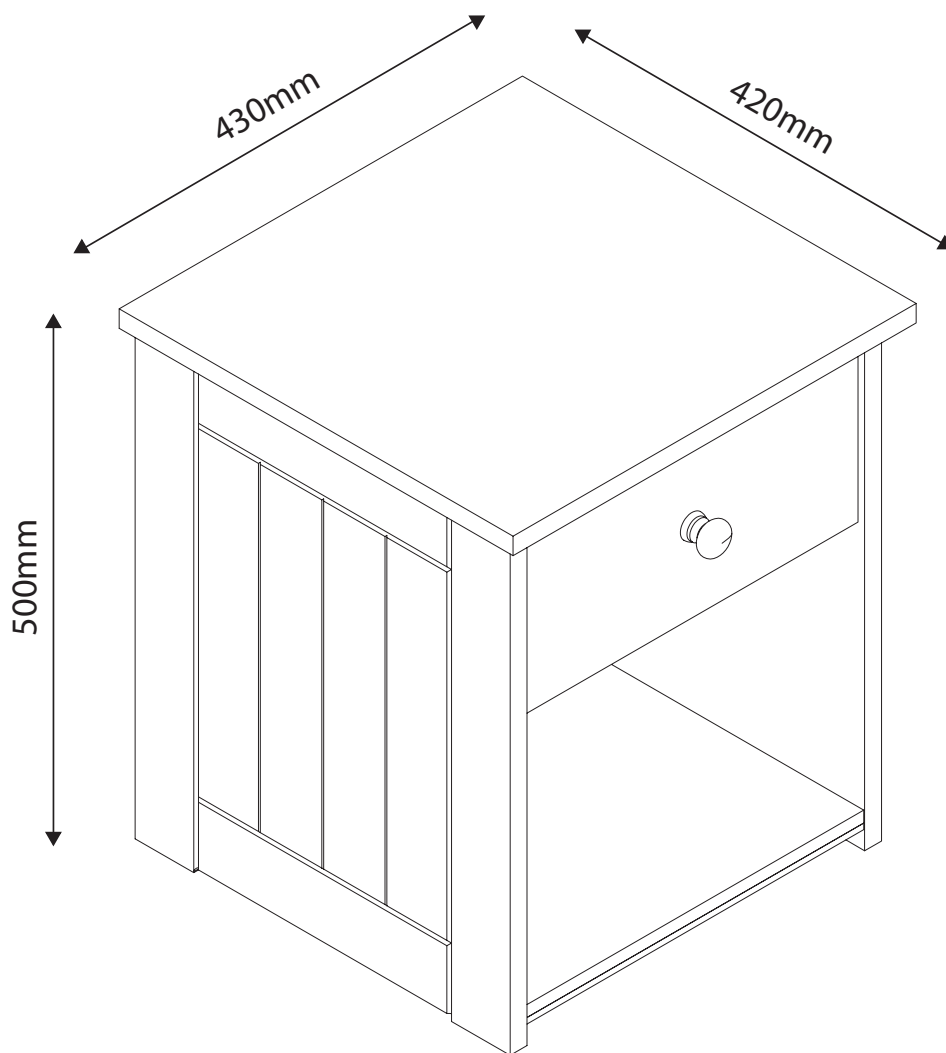

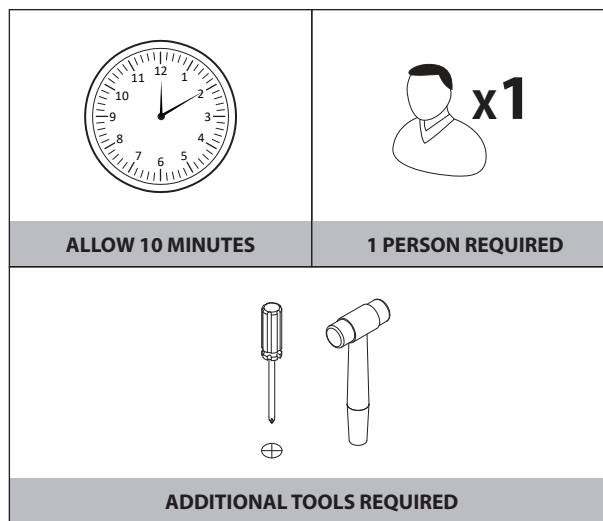

PRE-ASSEMBLY PREPARATION

Before you start:

1. Choose a clean, level, spacious assembly area. Avoid hard surfaces that may damage the product.
2. Take care when lifting. Product should be assembled as near as possible to the point of use.
3. Ensure that you have all required contents for complete assembly.
4. Always read the assembly instructions carefully before beginning assembly.
5. Keep all hardware parts and packaging out of reach of small children.
6. Do not over tighten the screws and bolts as this may damage the threads.



WARNING

Serious or fatal injuries may occur from furniture toppling over.

To help avoid this please follow the below recommendations:

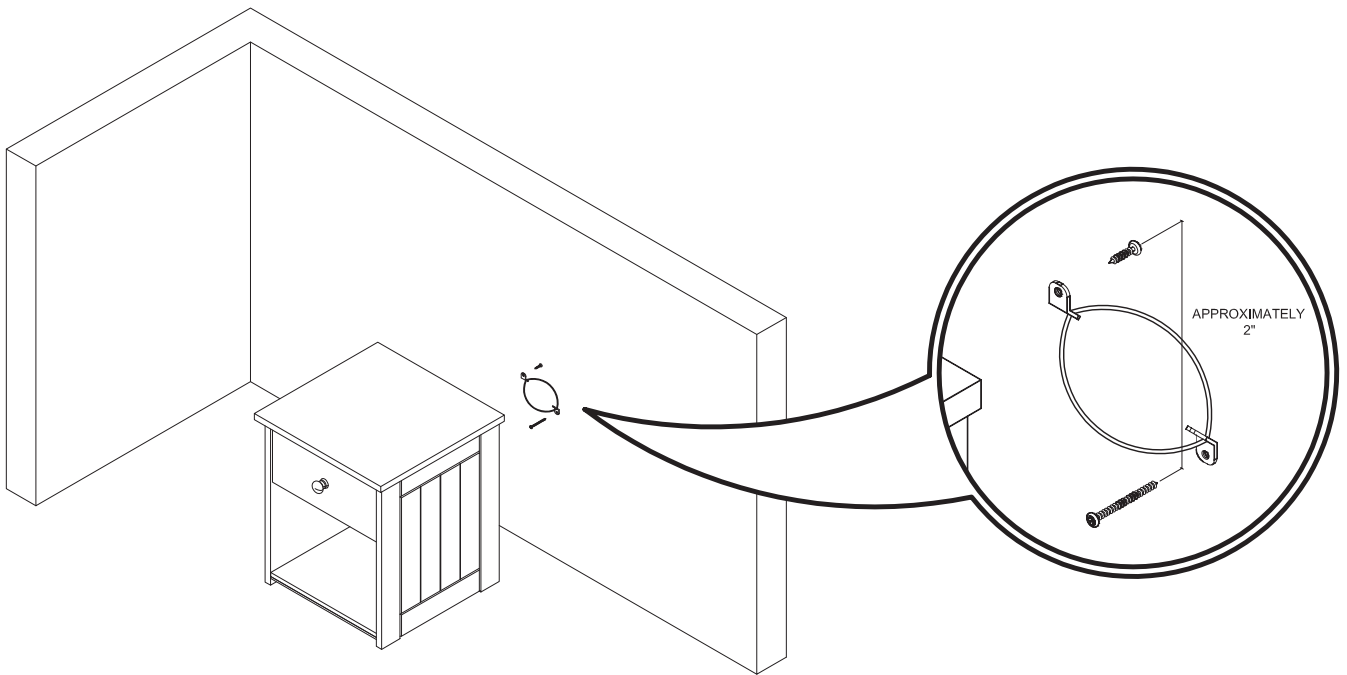
- Install the provided “Tipping Kit” as per the instructions
 - Never allow children to climb on or hang off of any part of this product
 - Unless specifically designed to accommodate, do not set TVs or other heavy objects on top of this product
- If this product has drawers:
- Place the heaviest items in lowest drawers
 - Do not open more than 1 drawer at a time as this may cause the product to become unbalanced
 - Do not tamper with or remove any drawer interlocking/running system

Note: The use of the provided “Tipping Kit” may reduce but not necessarily eliminate the risk of furniture toppling over. Please use this product with caution.

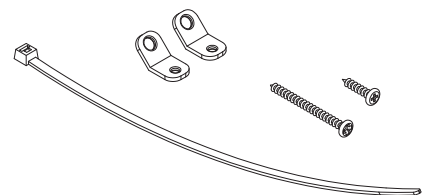
This is a permanent label. Do not attempt to remove!

ANTI TIPPING KIT INSTALLATION INSTRUCTION

1. Attach the bracket to the back top rail of the furniture using the 18mm screw provided through the small hole.
2. Locate the other bracket on the wall 50mm below the bracket on the unit. Care should be taken to ensure that this is securely fastened to the wall. The best method of fixing will depend upon the construction of the wall. Please note we do not supply fittings for this purpose as the type of fixing required will vary depending upon your wall.
3. Place the furniture into position so both mounting brackets are vertically in line.
4. Lace the end of the restraint strap through the larger hole in each mounting bracket. Bring both ends together and slide the flat end through the locking end and draw it through until all slack is removed.
5. Confirm that the strap is securely laced and locked.

IMPORTANT : CARE GUIDE FOR YOUR TIMBER FURNITURE

- A multi-step finish is applied to all our furniture, but all wood comes from nature. Because of this, there will be natural variations in surface texture and grain like knots, mineral streaks and sap runs that may affect the finish. These differences in character are not defects, but distinctions that make each piece of furniture unique.
- Our furniture is build to last. Following these steps for basic care should protect your investment for years to come.
- Dust frequently with a clean damp lint-free cloth. This will help remove abrasive build up which can damage a finish over time.
- Do not place hot objects on any furniture surface. Always use hot plate or placement. Laminate and lacquer finishes on table tops provide added scratch and heat resistance to our furniture, but they can still be damaged without proper care.
- Avoid exposing your furniture to strong sunlight, heat outlet, open windows or dampness. Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight can fade the finish of your furniture, while extreme temperature and humidity changes can cause cracking or splitting.
- Do not expose your furniture to any liquids. Never allow water to sit on your furniture. Alcohol, nail polish and perfume are also dangerous as they will dissolve the lacquer finish on contact and may require professional repairs.
- Do not allow plactic to come in direct contact with your furniture. Chemicals in the plastic of placemats etc may soften and mark the finish if left in contact with the furniture for a period of time.
