

Care and maintenance



Cushions

- Direct exposure to the Sun's harmful UV rays is likely to cause rapid colour fading to fabrics. For best results we recommend avoiding exposure to direct sunlight
- To ensure product longevity it is recommended outdoor products are not left permanently exposed to the elements
- Spot clean using mild detergent and damp cloth. Dry flat in shade
- □ Do not unzip
- Do not put in washing machine
- □ Do not tumble dry
- □ Do not bleach
- □ Do not dry clean
- □ Cool iron only

Metal

- Item is designed for use outdoors. However we do not recommend leaving this product outside when not in use. To preserve the life of this item, avoid prolonged exposure to the elements & store inside/under cover or use an outdoor cover.
- DO NOT allow the furniture to be left in the rain or left wet for extended periods of time.
- Wipe furniture Dry immediately after it becoming wet.
- DO NOT clean your furniture down with any harsh solvents, abrasives or chemicals.
- ☐ To remove dirt and grime, simply rinse with fresh water or periodically clean using a sponge and mild detergent solution as required

Wicker

- Regular vacuuming and dusting of items is recommended.
- If weave on wicker becomes lacerated/damaged, do not pull on it as this may cause unravelling.
- Prolonged exposure to the elements may cause colour fading.
- To extend the life of your product the use of an Amart approved Outdoor Furniture Cover is highly recommended. Please contact store of purchase for further details.
