



PRE-ASSEMBLYPREPARATION

Before you start:

- 1. Choose a clean, level, spacious assembly area. Avoid hard surfaces that may damage the product.
- 2. Take care when lifting. Product should be assembled as near as possible to the point of use.
- 3. Ensure that you have all required contents for complete assembly
- 4. Always read the assembly instructions carefully before beginning assembly.
- 5. Keep all hardware parts and packaging out of reach of small children.
- 6. Do not over tighten the screws and bolts as this may damage the threads.





SAFETY BRACKETS INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Attach one Mouting Palte to the wall with the large screw. Make sure to attach the mounting palte into a stud. If mouting into brick or masnry you will need to acquire wall anchors.
- 2. Attach the second Mounting Plate to the furniture frame with the Short Screws
- 3. Move the furniture to its final position. Thread a Wall Strap through the both Mounting Plates and tighten until snug. Do not over tighten.

NOTE


- This product must be fixed to a wall.
- As wall materials vary, screws and wall fixing are not always included.
- Make sure fixing are attached to a wall stud.
- If mounting onto brick or masonry you will need to acpuire wall anchors.
- Consult your local hardware specialist on what wall fixing is appropriate.
- Check for plumbing or electrical wiring behind wall surfaces before comencing.

Ensure the correct wall fixing are used. Failure to do so may result in personal injury or cause property damge if product topples over.


As wall materials vary, screws for fixing to wall are not included. For advice on suitable screw systems, contact your local specialised dealer.

Always lift your product when moving / relocating. Do not drag, dragging can cause damage to the legs


HINGE ADJUSTMENT INSTRUCTION



PLEASE NOTE:

Clearance around the door can be altered by adjustment of the hinge screws.

- The gap between the front and back of the door is adjusted by screw (1)
- The upper and lower clearance is adjusted by the (2) screws.
- The left and right clearance is adjusted by screw (3)



PLEASE NOTE:

The door can be removed by unscrewing all the screws that attach the hinges to the wood inside.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Product Care for Timber Items

As our timber is supplied from sustainable forests there will be natural variations in surface texture and grain like knots, mineral streaks and sap runs that may affect the finish. These differences in character are not defects, but distinctions that make each piece of furniture unique

Our furniture is built to last. Following these steps for basic care should protect your investment for years to come

- Dust frequently with a clean damp lint-free cloth. This will help remove abrasive build up which can damage a finish over time
- Do not place hot objects on any furniture surface. Always use a hot plate or placemat. Laminate and lacquer finishes on table tops provide added scratch and heat resistance to our furniture, but they can still be damaged without proper care
- Avoid exposing your furniture to strong sunlight, heat outlet, open windows or dampness. Prolonged exposure to direct sunlight can fade the finish of your furniture, while extreme temperature and humidity changes can cause cracking or splitting
- Do not expose your furniture to any liquids. Never allow water to sit on your furniture. Alcohol, nail polish and perfume are also dangerous as they will dissolve the lacquer finish on contact and may require professional repairs
- Do not allow plastic to come in direct contact with your furniture. Chemicals in the plastic of placemats etc. may soften and mark the finish if left in contact with the furniture for a period of time
