




Before you start:




1. Choose a clean, level, spacious assembly area. Avoid hard surfaces that may damage the product.
2. Take care when lifting. Product should be assembled as near as possible to the point of use.
3. Ensure that you have all required contents for complete assembly.
4. Always read the assembly instructions carefully before beginning assembly.
5. Keep all hardware parts and packaging out of reach of small children.
6. Do not over tighten the screws and bolts as this may damage the threads.

- Tighten with allen key (C) .

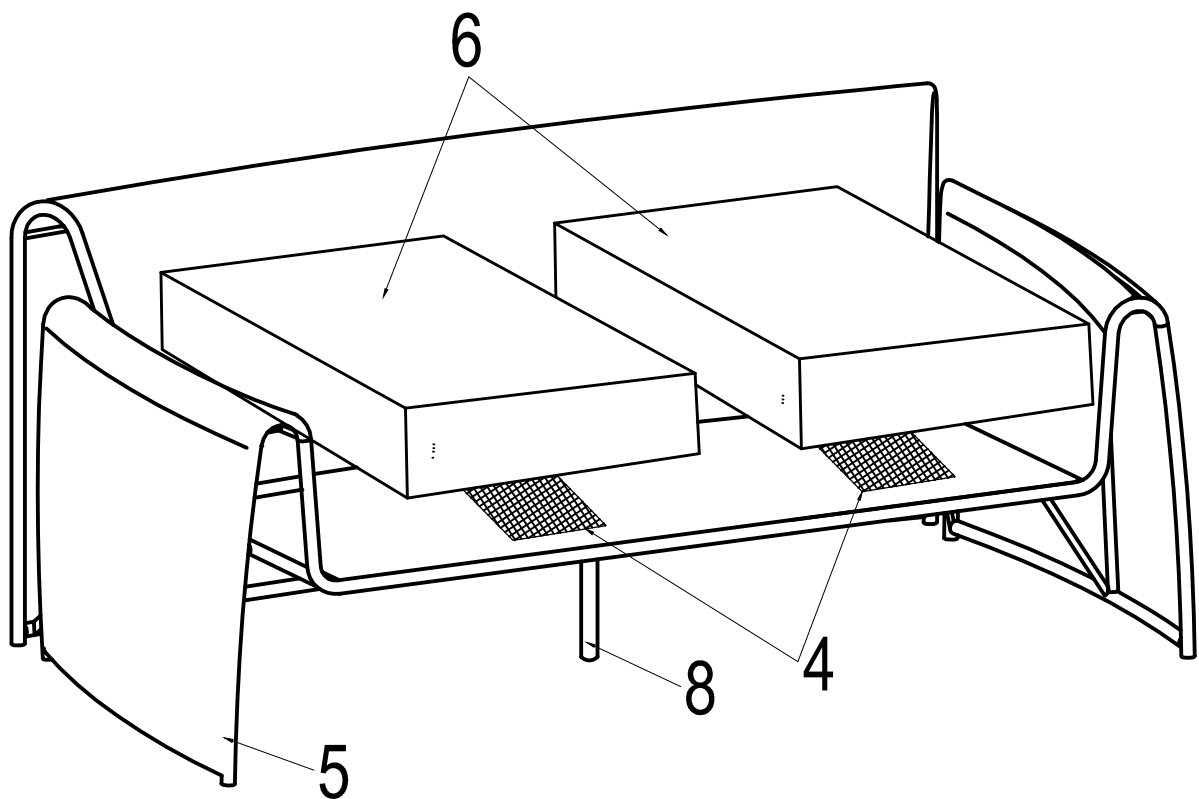

- Tighten with allen key (C) .



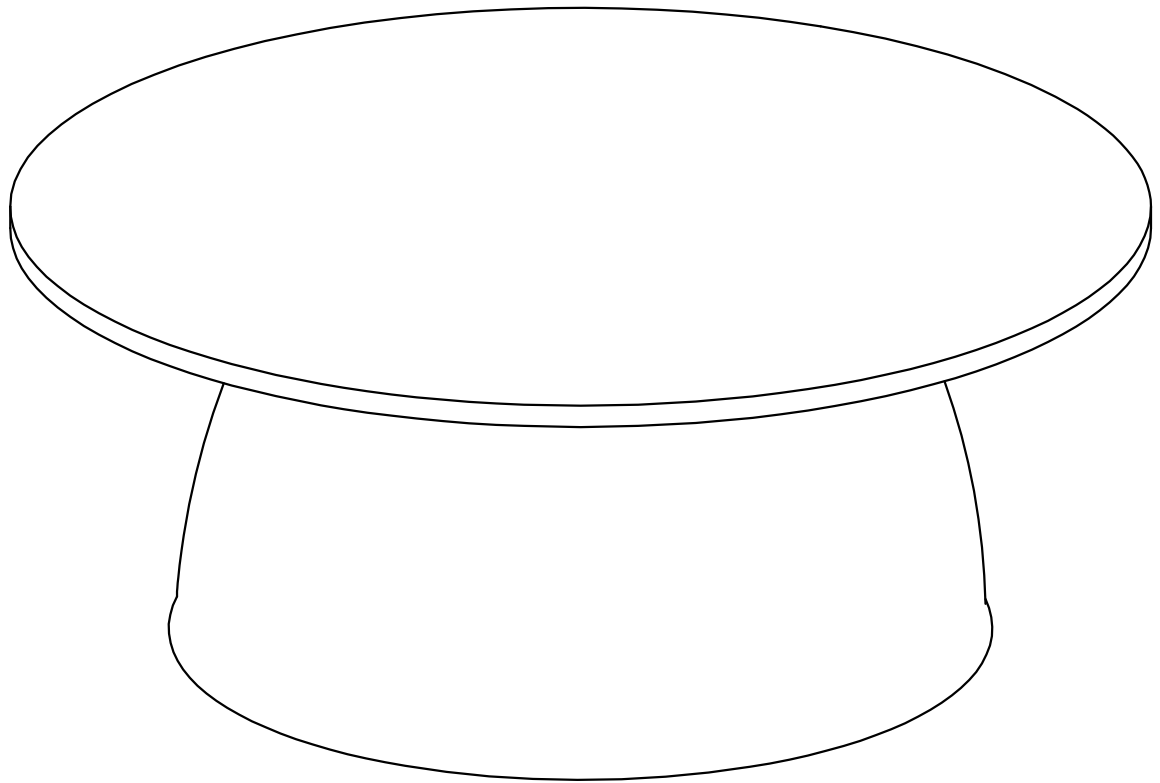

Care and maintenance

Metal

To ensure the longevity and maintain the appearance of your steel outdoor furniture, please follow these care instructions:

1. Usage and Storage:

Galvanised steel is designed for short term outdoor use due to its protective zinc coating, but, like all man-made materials, it can suffer damage if left exposed to the elements. To extend its life, avoid prolonged exposure to weather conditions. Store the furniture indoors or under cover when not in use or use an outdoor cover (do not store on grass).

2. Avoid Excess Moisture:

DO NOT allow the furniture to remain wet or sit in standing water for long periods. Wipe the furniture dry immediately if it becomes wet. Excess moisture can compromise the protective coating and lead to rust formation.

3. Avoid exposure to chlorine & salt water:

Chlorine/salt can disrupt the protective zinc oxide layer on steel, leading to accelerated corrosion. Once the protective layer is compromised it more susceptible to rust. This is particularly problematic in environments with high chlorine concentrations, such as in swimming pools, homes within a short distance of the ocean or areas with heavy chlorination.

4. Cleaning:

Clean your furniture with care. Avoid using harsh solvents, abrasives, or chemicals. To remove dirt and grime, rinse with fresh water and dry thoroughly. For a deeper clean, use a sponge and a mild detergent solution as needed. Abrasive cleaners will scratch/damage the surface.

Live by the beach? Due to a process called “aerosolisation”, sea water is broken up into tiny droplets by the wind and waves and salt particles are released into the air. This process accelerates the corrosion of metal surfaces over time. It is essential to use furniture covers when the product is not in use and clean your product more frequently.

By following these simple steps, you will help keep your furniture in great condition and ensure it remains a beautiful and functional part of your outdoor space.

Care and maintenance

Wicker

Wicker is a weaving technique used to create outdoor furniture, baskets, and decorative items. It involves weaving thin, flexible strands of materials like rattan, bamboo, or synthetic materials to form intricate patterns.

To ensure the longevity and maintain the appearance of your outdoor furniture, please follow these care instructions:

1. **Usage and Storage:** This item is designed for outdoor use, but, like all man-made materials, it can suffer damage if left exposed to the elements. To extend its life, avoid prolonged exposure to weather conditions. Store the furniture indoors/under cover when not in use and use an outdoor cover (do not store on grass).
2. **Sun Exposure:** Prolonged exposure to sunlight can cause wicker to dry out and become brittle, leading to cracks and potential unravelling of the weave. Sun exposure can also cause fading. To protect your furniture from UV damage, we recommend using a furniture cover when not in use, even when stored undercover or under an awning.
3. **Moisture Management:** While wicker is made from weather-resistant materials, prolonged exposure to moisture can still lead to mould or mildew. If the furniture gets wet, dry it thoroughly to prevent moisture buildup.
4. **Cleaning:** Regular cleaning is essential to maintain the appearance of your wicker furniture. Use a soft brush or vacuum with a brush attachment to remove dust and debris. For deeper cleaning, mix mild soap with warm water and gently scrub the surface with a cloth or sponge. Rinse thoroughly and dry immediately.

By following these care instructions, you can help ensure your outdoor wicker furniture remains attractive and functional for many seasons to come.

Care and maintenance

Sintered Stone

Daily Cleaning

- **General Stain Removal:** As the surface of sintered stone furniture is non - porous and non - absorbent, for daily cleaning, simply wiping with a soft, damp cloth can remove dust and light stains such as coffee stains and fruit juice stains. For more stubborn stains, a mild detergent can be used. However, avoid using cleaners that contain strong acids, strong alkalis, or abrasive components to prevent damage to the furniture surface.
- **Preventing Water Stain Residue:** After cleaning, wipe off the water in a timely manner to prevent water stain residue. Because long - term water stains may form water marks on the surface and affect the appearance.

Avoid Scratching and Collision

- **Careful Use:** In daily use, avoid using sharp objects such as knives and keys to scratch on the furniture surface, as this may cause scratches. Although sintered stone is relatively wear - resistant, sharp objects can still damage its surface.
- **Pay Attention to Moving:** When moving furniture, handle it with care and avoid collision with other hard objects. If you need to move heavy sintered stone furniture, it's best to ask professionals for help to prevent accidental collisions during the moving process and damage to the furniture.

Prevent Chemical Corrosion

- **Avoid Contact with Acid - Base Substances:** Sintered stone furniture should avoid contact with acidic or alkaline chemicals such as vinegar, lemon juice, and bleach. These substances may react chemically with the stone, causing the surface to discolor, corrode, or be damaged.
- **Choose Cleaners Carefully:** When choosing a cleaner, carefully check the product ingredients to ensure that it will not damage the sintered stone. If you're not sure whether a cleaner is suitable, you can first conduct a small - area test on an inconspicuous part of the furniture and observe whether there is any adverse reaction before using it.
